Before You Use A Fire Extinguisher

Make sure:

- ✓ to call the Mesa Fire Department (9-1-1).
- ✓ building is being evacuated.
- \checkmark to activate the fire alarms or alert others.
- ✓ the fire is small and confined.
- ✓ there is a way out (Never let the fire get between you and your way out.)

When You Use A Fire Extinguisher √ Remember PASS

- Pull the pin.

- Aim the extinguisher at the base of the flame.
- **S**queeze the operating lever (on top).
- Sweep the nozzle from side-to-side.

 Is the building address clearly posted, so it can be seen from the street? (Strip malls and Multi-tenant occupancies must have rear doors marked with address) 			
Is the fire lane clearly marked and free of obstructions?			
Can all exit doors be opened easily from the inside without a key?			
• On doors with panic hardware, is the push bar the only locking or latching device	? 🗖		
• Do all exit doors have only one approved locking device (no slide bolts)?			
Are all aisles, stairs and exits clear and unobstructed?			
Are all the bulbs in your exit signs working?			
If there are emergency lights, do they work?			
• Are all electrical cords in good shape, with no splices, cuts or crushed areas?			
Are all stored materials stacked so they are at least two feet below the ceiling?			
• Are there less than 30 gallons of flammable liquids stored in the building?			
Is there an emergency evacuation plan posted and practiced?			
• Is there clearance of all storage from around the hot water heater and boiler?			
• Do all electrical panels have a 30" clearance for easy access?			
Are all dumpsters five feet away from combustible walls?			
• Is the occupant load posted (required with 50 or more people) and not exceeded?			
Are approved fire extinguishers mounted in visible and accessible locations?			
Have the fire extinguishers been inspected and retagged this year?			
• Do employees know where extinguishers are located and how to use them?			

If the answer to any of these questions is no you should correct the situation to improve the safety of your business" A yes answer indicates the item is in compliance. Our goal is to increase your awareness of Fire and Life Safety, reduce your risks and liability, and to make your business a safer place for everyone in the community. Our visit and this checklist is a guide. It is not intended to identify all hazards that may exist in the business and does not relieve the occupant and/or owner of the responsibility to fix any safety hazard listed, found, or not identified. This checklist is for your use only, please keep it for your records.
