## COMPOSITION OF THE BOARD:

The Board is comprised of 11 members, including those representing:

- Financial institutions
- Nonprofit providers
- Manufactured housing
- Special needs providers
- Multi-family housing development providers
- Single-family housing development providers
- Plus 5 representatives from the community

Board members are appointed to the Board by the Mayor, with City Council approval. Board members are appointed for 3-year terms and cannot serve more than two complete consecutive terms. Previous board members may be re-appointed after a lapse of three years from end of previous term.



## AUTHORITY:

The Board is advisory to the Council and gives input and makes recommendations:

- Reviews and makes recommendations regarding the City's General Plan Housing Element and Housing Master Plan
- Provides requested assistance to City departments on housing issues
- Reviews and makes recommendations on the operation of the housing programs
- Participates in the annual evaluation process for the allocation of the application of funds for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME), Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG), and Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP)
- Assesses the Human Services needs and develop priorities for funding
- Participates in the annual evaluation process for Human Services funds and ABC (A Better Community) funds
- Participates in the evaluation process of any other grant or social service funds that may become available to the City
- Performs other duties as may be approved by City Council

## MEETINGS:

The Housing & Community Development Advisory Board meets on the first Thursday of each month in the Mesa City Council Chambers, Lower Level, at 57 East First Street, Mesa, AZ 85201 at 6:00 p.m., unless otherwise noted.

## ELIGIBILITY:

Prospective board members must be a resident of Mesa and must complete an application form. Service on the board is voluntary – no compensation is provided.
