A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESA, MARICOPA COUNTY, ARIZONA, APPROVING A FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL PROGRAM FOR THE CITY OF MESA FOR FISCAL YEARS 2019/2020 to 2023/2024.

WHEREAS, prior to the 2019/2020 fiscal year, the City Manager of the City of Mesa did prepare and submit a Five-Year Capital Program for the City of Mesa for fiscal years 2019/2020 to 2023/2024 (“Capital Program”) pursuant to the provisions of Section 605 of the Mesa City Charter;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Section 606 of the Mesa City Charter, a general summary of the proposed Capital Program and notice were published for the period required, notice of the hearing on the proposed Capital Program was published as required, and the proposed Capital Program was available for inspection by the public as required; and

WHEREAS, the public hearing was held at the City Council Chambers in the City of Mesa on Monday, May 20, 2019 at 5:45 p.m., at which meeting all interested persons were invited to appear and be heard in favor of or against adoption of the Capital Program.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESA, MARICOPA COUNTY, ARIZONA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: That the Capital Program (a summary of which is attached as Exhibit A), heretofore submitted by the City Manager pursuant to the provisions of Section 605 of the Mesa City Charter and, copies of which are posted on the City’s website, is adopted in its entirety.
